Admission Policies of the School of Human Sciences

Since its founding in 1972, the School of Human Sciences, based on Osaka University Admission Policies, has put emphasis on comprehensive understanding of various aspects of humans and society by means of a variety of methods in the natural sciences, social sciences, and humanities. Therefore, while neither focusing on the liberal arts or science, what one has learned in general education classes and specialized education classes in senior high school and other educational institutes will become meaningful after enrollment in this school.

- The School of Human Sciences selects students by examining the level of understanding acquired in senior high school of Japanese, mathematics, foreign language, geography, history, civics, and science.
- This school puts emphasis on well-balanced academic abilities and foreign language proficiency enabling interdisciplinary learning and research, the foundation of international communication.
- Regarding third-year students entering from other schools, this school seeks students who have acquired a certain level of understanding in a variety of academic fields at university, two-year college, or technical high school and who will be able to develop the power of insight into human beings at this school. The exam for admission includes an English proficiency test, a short essay, a test regarding specialized basic subjects, and an interview.
- In order to nurture personnel who will be active on the international stage, this school has classes conducted totally in English, the "Human Sciences All-English Undergraduate Degree Program," in which active communication ability in English is emphasized.
