

School of Law

Based on Osaka University Admission Policies, the School of Law seeks to admit students able to develop their abilities to understand things, persuade others, and cultivate concepts. Specifically, such students would be:

1. Individuals capable of deep understanding from multiple viewpoints and angles.
2. Individuals who can think theoretically and discuss things actively.
3. Individuals who can talk about dreams for Japan and the world's future.
4. Individuals who take and imagine others' pain, find problems, and try to solve them.

In order to determine if applicants have foreign language proficiency, logical thinking power, and education necessary for learning at the School of Law, the school selects students in the manner noted below.

In the February Individual Achievement Examinations, together with the applicant's scores on the examinations made by the National Center for University Entrance Examinations, the school evaluates scores in Japanese, mathematics, and foreign language.

In the March Individual Achievement Examinations, together with the applicant's scores on the examinations made by the National Center for University Entrance Examinations, the school assesses scores in the English test and the short essay.
