## 2. Eligibility of Applicants

In order to be eligible, individuals not possessing Japanese citizenship, should have scores on the Japanese University Admission Examination for International Students equal to or above the scores shown on the table on page 3. Those individuals also must fit into one of the categories (1~5) below.

Please note that individuals wishing to apply for the School of Foreign Studies, Faculty of Medicine, Division of Health Sciences, or School of Dentistry don't need to take TOEFL.

**To be eligible, you must fit one of the categories below:** (Examination subjects vary depending on school. Please view the table inside the front cover for details.)

1. Individuals who have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year overseas school curriculum by March 31, 2010 and who will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010.
2. Individuals who passed an official or equivalent examination of their country certifying possession of academic qualifications equal to or above those who completed a 12-year school curriculum and who will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010.
3. Individuals who completed high school including those who passed an official examination of their country certifying possession of academic qualifications equal to or above those of high school graduate) and who completed a curriculum for preparing for a university in Japan at one of educational facilities in Table 1 on page 7, or the lists on page 9 and who will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010. (Regarding the first list, curriculum consisting of training at said facilities; regarding the second list, curriculum consisting of subjects necessary for enrolling in a Japanese university at said facilities.
4. Individuals who have an IB diploma granted by the International Baccalaureate Organization and who will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010.
5. Individuals who have an Abitur qualification (recognized as a university admission requirement in states in Federal Republic of Germany) and who will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010.

Depending upon the circumstances, applications from individuals who graduated from foreign educational facilities such as international or overseas American schools may not be accepted. Individuals wishing to apply based on such qualifications should, as early as possible, inquire regarding their eligibility to the Admission Division **before making application**. ### **Submitting TOEFL scores**

Submit valid **two types** of TOEFL score reports (a score of a test taken within the last two years.) by the deadline. Older test scores will not be accepted.

1. Official Score Report directly sent from the Educational Testing Service (ETS) in the United States
2. A copy of Examinee's Score Record sent to the examinee

Before you make application, make sure your Official Score Report has arrived at Osaka University by phone. (Telephone 06-6879-7097 Monday through Friday excluding national holidays, 9:00 – 12:00, 13:00- 17:00)

When submitting the above documents, please note the following:

- Please apply for the score sheet to be sent directly from ETS so it will arrive in the Admission Division, Department of Student Affairs by the application deadline.
- **It takes a month or longer for scores to arrive in Osaka University after applying for an Official Score report with ETS. Please take the test a minimum of one month before making application.**
- When applying, please register Institution Code Recipient Code **8404** in accordance with specified instructions.
- When applying, enter “Osaka University—Admission Division, Department of Student Affairs” in the column of name of institution.
- Scores from a TOEFL-ITP (Institutional Testing Program) will **not** be accepted.

### 3. Screening Method

Applicants are screened according to their scores on the Japanese University Admission Examination for International Students and TOEFL, results of each school's scholastic ability tests shown in the following table, and contents of submitted documents.

However, for the School of Foreign Studies, Division of Health Sciences of Faculty of Medicine, and School of Dentistry, TOEFL scores are not used for screening.

## 11. Handling of Personal Information

1. Personal information such as name and address will be used during processes such as screening of students, processing applications, conducting screening tests, announcement of successful applicants, and taking admission procedures. ## Advanced Credits

Students can transfer to Osaka University up to 60 credits earned at another university or junior college at home or abroad as advanced credits if such credits are considered educationally beneficial. Credits earned as a special student stipulated in Article 31, Standards for Establishment of Universities, Ordinance of the Ministry of Education, Science and Culture No. 28 of 1956 are also included.

Individuals wishing to transfer credits earned at another university are required to ask educational affairs staff of the school they are enrolling in for procedure guidelines and a request form for credit transfer, which will be available early March. **Make application by Friday, March 26 with necessary documents. Only envelopes postmarked on or before Thursday, March 25 will be accepted.**

An individual recognized as encountering difficulty in the payment of tuition fees due to the death of the party responsible for the payment of their school expenses, or as a result of suffering due to a natural disaster experienced by the individual in question or the party responsible for the payment of the individual’s school expenses within a year of their entrance to the University.</li> </ol>

Osaka University has two dormitories for international students: the **Suita International Student Dormitory** and the **Osaka University International House**. The maximum duration of stay in either is one year.

Application must be made between the *first day* of the month three months in advance of your intended residency and the *final day* of the month two months prior to your intended residency (excluding the New Year holidays). For example, if you wish to begin residence from April, you can apply from the beginning of January through the end of February. Application for residency can be made through the end of April; however, in such cases, residency begins two or three months later. In the case of application in April, residency starts in June or July.

Please note that the number of international students wishing to reside in the dormitory is increasing these days. Not all applicants can be accepted. Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Individuals wishing to obtain residency are requested to make application as soon as possible.

- 1) Before deciding on your residence, please visit the apartment you're planning to lease and confirm with the landlord the lease conditions.

- 3) Real estate agents are strictly prohibited coming on campus to assist students in finding housing. Be careful not to give them the impression they can do this.

## Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research

Personal Liability Insurance for Students is a nationwide system to indemnify students for the number of days that treatment is needed for injury incurred during regular curricular activities, extracurricular activities, or while commuting to and from university. If you should become a victim of an accident or disaster and if your recovery takes a long time, an enormous economic hardship may be imposed on you and your family. It is for this reason that **at the time of admission, all students are required to participate in this insurance plan in which national and public universities participate.**

## Questions and answers regarding eligibility for applicants

Q1. What does exactly “Individuals who have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year overseas school curriculum (Article 150, paragraph 1, Ordinance for Enforcement of the School Education Law)” refer to? What about a person who attended school for 11 years due to skipping a grade or a person who attended overseas school for 6 years after finishing elementary school in Japan?

### **Important point**

Eligibility is determined whether a person has finished the 12th year curriculum of overseas regular school.

A1. “Individuals who have completed a 12-year overseas school curriculum” refers to “individuals who have completed the 12th year curriculum of overseas regular school education.”

Therefore, those who attended school for less than 12 years due to a grade skipping or those who attended overseas school for less than 12 years due to the education in Japan, if their final curriculum is a 12th or later overseas school curriculum, are eligible for application. Regarding if the curriculum you have completed is regular school curriculum or what number of your final curriculum was, please direct questions to an embassy of the country you received education.

Q2. If a person who has completed of education overseas school equivalent to senior high school in Japan but it is considered to have completed only an 11-year school education, in what way(s) he/she can enroll in university?

### **Important point**

You will need to complete the curriculum or qualification making up for the shortage of years of education by completing university preparatory courses in Japan.

A2. In case when a person completed a curriculum of school equivalent to senior high school in Japan but it is considered to have completed only an 11-year school curriculum, the person will be eligible by completing specified university preparatory courses in Japan. (For university preparatory courses designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, see page 4.)

Individuals who have a university entrance qualification certificate such as International Baccalaureate, Abitur, or baccalaureat and will reach the age of 18 by March 31, 2010 are eligible.

An applicant’s education history and eligibility should be confirmed before making application. Please contact the Admission Division.

Q3. Are individuals finishing International School eligible applicants?

**Important point**

Eligibility is determined by the status of the international school in the country where you received education.

A3. An applicant who has completed overseas international school is eligible, if the person is considered to have completed the 12th curriculum of regular education in the country where the international school is located.

Furthermore, if the person has a university entrance qualification certificate such as International Baccalaureate, Abitur, or baccalaureat by graduating from international school and has reached the age of 18 may be eligible.

In case an applicant graduated from international school, he/she is required to submit necessary documents before making application in order to confirm the eligibility. So please contact the Admission Division as soon as possible. Please note that application may be not accepted if the eligibility has not been confirmed in advance.)
