(For students living overseas who are currently enrolled in an educational institution outside Japan and studying in a Korean-based education system.)

An overview of the Special Entrance Examination for Privately-Funded International Students Living Overseas


The mission of Osaka University is to nurture outstanding individuals who possess a high sense of ethics to become global citizens and leaders in a variety of fields worldwide under the objective of "Live Locally, Grow Globally". To accomplish this mission, it is critical to create an internationally-minded campus where Japanese students and international students challenge and enrich each other. For this purpose, Osaka University is committed to inviting outstanding international students to join its schools as well as sending Japanese students overseas, and to expanding courses taught by foreign faculty members and offered in English. As such, the future of Osaka University relies upon motivated students coming from all over the world to spread the knowledge and abilities they acquire here.

Standing by this principle, Osaka University has established a new Entrance Examination Program in order to accept international students for four-year studies, thereby increasing the number of undergraduate international students who can converse in Japanese, study together and share a variety of perspectives with Japanese students. Under this entrance examination program, applicants can take the entrance examination in their own country prior to coming to Japan. Those who passed the examination will then come to Japan and begin their studies at Osaka University. Applicants with outstanding academic performance and overall excellence who participate in this program may be eligible for tuition fee exemption or scholarship programs. They will also be given priority to reside in on-campus dormitories for the first year of their studies. Tuition fee exemption or scholarships may continue for the second year, as well as for subsequent years for those students who show outstanding academic performance and overall excellence.

Osaka University welcomes a diversity of prospective students who have acquired outstanding academic abilities, who are interested in learning Japanese while directly interacting with peers and faculty from other cultures, who think for themselves and do not just mechanically absorb information, and who actively strive to discover and share the truth.

- Applicants must pass the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test level N1, or have a proficiency level equivalent to JLPT level N1, prior to submitting an application. For further details, please refer to <u>2</u>. <u>Eligibility for application</u>.
- Applicants who pass the entrance examination and complete the enrollment procedures are expected to begin their undergraduate studies at Osaka University in April 2017.

The full process from application submission to enrollment is shown below.

2. Application eligibility

Applicants must have been living overseas for one year or longer at the date of Interview (October 16, 2016) and satisfy all conditions below:

(Note: Study abroad and exchange programs in Japan count toward overseas residency. However, applicants may not reside in Japan during the date of Interview.)

- (1) Applicants cannot hold Japanese citizenship, dual citizenship (with Japanese being one), or Japanese permanent residence;
- (2) Applicants must have completed or should be expected to complete a standard 12-year school education curriculum in Korea or by Korean education standards, as the case may be, by March 31, 2017
- (3) Applicants must meet either of the following criteria:
 - (i) Have passed the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test level N1;
 - (ii) Possess Japanese language proficiency at a level equivalent to level N1 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test, and receive a certification letter stating their level from the school principal, a Japanese language teacher or any equivalent person from the last school they attended.
- (4) Applicants are expected to take the College Scholastic Ability Test (CSAT) in 2016.

3. Application materials

- (1) Please submit originals of all materials unless "copy" is expressly required.
- (2) Incomplete applications will not be accepted. Once submitted, application materials may not be changed.
- (3) Once submitted, application materials will not be returned.
- (4) If any false information is identified in any of the application materials, application procedures will be terminated immediately. Similarly, admission to the university will be revoked, even after the applicant has been declared accepted.
- (5) Application forms can be downloaded from the Osaka University website.

5. Documents required after submitting application materials

A copy of the results of the College Scholastic Ability Test (CSAT) 2016

<Note>

- (1) A copy of your official CSAT score card <u>in Korean</u>, which will be used in the screening process of application materials, must be submitted to the Admission Division, Department of Education and Student Affairs, Osaka University by e-mail or fax by Thursday, December 8, 2016, at 17:00, Japan Time. Please refer to <u>15. Contact for inquiries</u>. Failure to submit your CSAT score card will result in your application not being considered for admission.
- (2) In case any false information is identified in your CSAT score card, you will be denied admission to the Osaka University even if a favorable decision had been previously reached on your application.

6. Applicant selection, etc.

Successful applicants will be selected through screening of application materials and CSAT results. An interview (including a basic academic skills test) may also be held, if necessary. If an interview is held, successful applicants will be selected based on the results of the screening of application materials and CSAT results as well as the interview.

Interview

If Osaka University deems that an interview is necessary to assess an applicant, the interview will be held as follows:

Location: Interviews will be	held in Korea at a venue determined by Osaka University, or via the Internet	or

Contents: Interviews will be held at a time and date specified by Osaka University. A basic academic skills test may also be carried out at the time of interview, depending on the applicant's desired school/faculty and department.

Applicants will be notified directly of scheduling details for their interview.

7. Announcement of successful applicants

Mid December, 2016

Applicants will be notified by e-mail. The Visa Procedure will be informed as well.

8. Procedure for the enrollment to the undergraduate school as a first-year student

Early-March, 2017

Students will be notified individually of the details for the procedure of enrollment.

9. Enrollment in the undergraduate school as a first-year student

April 2017

10. Enrollment fee and tuition fee for undergraduate school

- (1) Enrollment fee: 282,000 JPY
- (2) Tuition fee (the same for the spring semester and fall semester): 267,900 JPY (annual tuition fee: 535,800 JPY)
 - * The enrollment fee and the tuition fee may be changed at any time.
 - * If the tuition fee is changed during enrollment, the revised tuition fee will apply from the time of revision.

11. Handling of personal information

(1) Names, addresses and other personal information provided at the time of application will be used only for the selection of persons to be admitted (processing of applications and carrying out selection examinations), announcement of successful applicants and procedures for the enrollment and other affairs related to entrance examination.

However, personal information of those admitted will also be used for educational affairs (student registry management, school guidance, etc.), student support services (health management, tuition fee exemption, scholarship application, career support, etc.) and collection of tuition fees.

- (2) Results of examination and other personal information used for the selection of persons to be admitted will be used for the aggregate analysis of entrance examination results, surveys and research on the method of selection of persons to be admitted and student support services (scholarship application, etc.).
- (3) Osaka University may outsource some of the aforementioned affairs in (1) and (2) above to an outside contractor. In this case, prior to the provision of the entire or partial personal information provided to Osaka University to such outside contractor, Osaka University will enter into an agreement with such outside contractor to ensure that personal information is handled in a proper manner.

12. Visa / Status of residence

International students who are selected for admission to Osaka University must obtain a student visa from the Japanese Embassy or Consulate-General of Japan nearby prior to arriving to Japan. When applying for a visa, a Certificate of Eligibility for Status of Residence (CESR) is required. The Osaka University Support Office for International Students and Scholars will apply for a CESR to the Immigration Bureau of Japan, and once a CESR is issued, the Support Office will send it to the applicant.

Details will be notified to successful applicants at the same time that a notice of acceptance is sent.

If the residence status of an international student is not "Student", such international student is not eligible to apply for a dormitory for international students, receive scholarships and other privileges granted to international students.

13. Financial support

International students exceling academically and with an outstanding personality may receive exemption of tuition fee or Osaka University scholarships.

14. Housing support

International students enrolled at Osaka University through this entrance examination will be able to live in on-campus student dormitories for the duration of their first year of studies, on a preferential basis. However, dormitory fee and other relevant fees must be paid by the resident.
