Outline	The Human Information Engineering Lab, Department of Bioinformatics Engineering, Graduate School of Information Science and Technology, The University of Osaka, has been commissioned by the Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST) to conduct research under the auspices of the Strategic Basic Research Program (CREST) project titled “Establishing Nonverbal Communication Channels to Promote Human-AI Coexistence and Collaboration” in “[Symbiotic AI Interdisciplinary Systems] Creation of Interdisciplinary System Foundation for a Symbiotic and Collaborative Society with Humans and AI” Area. This research project will be conducted as a joint project with Professor Norihiko Saga of Kwansei Gakuin University and Associate Professor Hiroyuki Iizuka of Hokkaido University.
