

Study Abroad Preparation with Aptis 中級 Intermediate

[到達度目標]

- to give students both the ability and the confidence to communicate effectively in English on a range of topics related to studying abroad.
- to develop students' knowledge of language, particularly vocabulary, in a range of contexts related to studying abroad.
- to develop and practise the speaking and writing skills needed to do well in the Aptis English test.

[コース概要]

This course is a topic based, integrated skills course with an emphasis on effective communication. Topics covered will be stimulating and relevant to studying abroad to maximise motivation and language development.

Students will cover the four skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing, though effective and confident oral communication will be highlighted. The course will also include language development and pronunciation. Students will be encouraged to speak English in class at all times.

Regarding preparation for the Aptis test, students will be given the opportunity to develop and practise the speaking skills needed to do well in the test, such as answering questions about themselves, comparing and speculating about photographs, speaking for a long turn and taking part in discussions on general topics. Students will also practise writing formal and informal e-mails both in class and for homework.
