Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine Awarded to Distinguished Honorary Professor Shimon Sakaguchi

Distinguished Honorary Professor Shimon Sakaguchi was awarded the 2025 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine for his seminal discovery of regulatory T cells (Tregs), immune cells essential for maintaining self-tolerance. This groundbreaking achievement established the field of peripheral tolerance, reshaping global understanding of autoimmune diseases and cancer while opening new avenues for innovative therapies. Building on this spirit of excellence, the university continues to create convergence knowledge rooted in world-class research, advancing solutions for a resilient and sustainable future society.

Osaka, Japan

Osaka is one of the biggest metropolitan areas in Japan and is the center of the Kansai region, which consists of Osaka, Kyoto, and several prefectures. Though the prefecture itself is the second smallest nationwide, it ranks second economically and has the third highest population. About nine percent of all foreign residents live in Osaka, and it is the second most popular destination to study abroad.



The University of Osaka

Located in northern Osaka, the University of Osaka (UOsaka) has three campuses in the cities of Suita, Toyonaka, and Minoh. All are just outside the center of Osaka city, and offer easy access to Osaka (Itami) Airport and the bullet train at Shin-Osaka Station. We welcome researchers and students from around the globe to our 11 schools; 15 graduate schools; 22 research institutes,

centers, and facilities; four libraries; and two university hospitals. Under the motto of "Live Locally, Grow Globally," some of the most advanced research in the world is taking place here at the university. With so many cultures, backgrounds, and ways of thinking all in one place, UOsaka provides an enriching environment for people from all walks of life.

Campuses

Suita Campus

Suita campus is the largest of the three campuses, the headquarters of UOsaka, and is adjacent to the north edge of Expo '70 Commemorative Park. A large number of industry-university joint projects are conducted here, and it also houses numerous world-renowned research institutes, schools, and graduate schools in addition to two university hospitals. Based on the experience of the COVID-19 pandemic, a research center was established in April 2021 to amass knowledge and talent for the purpose of safeguarding our lives from the threat of infectious diseases.



Toyonaka Campus

The Main Library, the Museum of Osaka University, five schools, and seven graduate schools are located on our Toyonaka campus. It is always bustling with students and is considered our most lively campus. It is a great place to find friends and get in touch with the community. First and second-year undergraduate students spend most of their time on this campus studying general education at the Center for Education in Liberal Arts and Sciences, and a number of graduate students and researchers study and work at the numerous graduate schools and research institutes on the campus.

Minoh Campus

In April 2021, Minoh campus was moved to a new location directly connected to the new train station opened in 2024. It is home to 25 language departments in our School of Foreign Studies and has one of Japan's two national preparatory education institutions to help international students learn Japanese. It is also open to the public and enables citizens to interact with our world and culture through the university's facilities. The International Studies Library, a new type of library integrated with the Minoh City Library, and a new student dormitory opened on the campus as well.

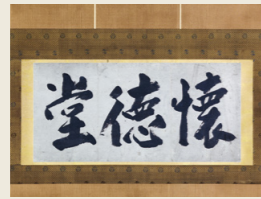


History

The roots of UOsaka can be traced to Kaitokudo and Tekijuku, two academies that delivered front-line scholarship during the Edo period (1603-1867). This tradition is inherent in UOsaka today which continues to achieve cutting-edge research results worthy of international recognition and provide society with distinguished researchers and professionals.

1724 Kaitokudo

Kaitokudo was an academy founded in 1724 by Osaka merchants. It contributed to the development of education and business morality for the remaining 140 years of the Edo period, playing an important role in education in Osaka as a civic and liberal arts college.



1838 Tekijuku

Tekijuku was a private academy in Osaka founded in 1838 by Koan Ogata, a physician and renowned educator. Young minds from all over Japan gathered there to learn, and many of them later played leading roles in the modernization of Japan during the Meiji period.

Osaka Imperial University

Osaka Imperial University was founded in 1931 with passionate support from the local government, the Kansai business community, and the citizens of Osaka as a citizen-led imperial university.

Integration of Osaka University and Osaka University of Foreign Studies

Established originally as Osaka School of Foreign Languages in 1921, it was founded with the money donated to the government by an Osaka-based businesswoman who was passionate about establishing a "school capable of nurturing internationally-minded people in Osaka." Thus, Osaka School of Foreign Studies shares a similar background to that of UOsaka.

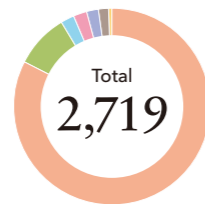

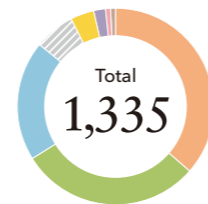

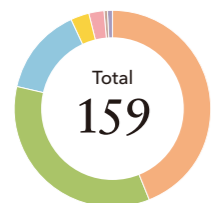

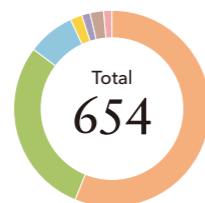

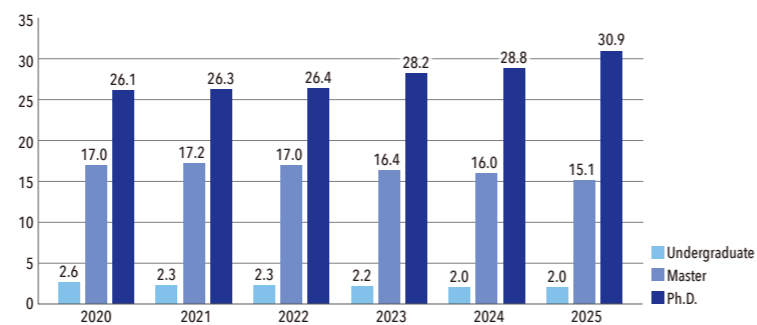
