Brief Description of Institution

Rooted in Kaitokudo and Tekijuku, The University of Osaka (UOsaka) was founded in 1931 and has continued to address many societal challenges, with the motto, "Live Locally, Glow Globally".

Today, The University of Osaka, with the incorporation of Osaka University of Foreign Studies, is a comprehensive research university comprising 11 schools, 15 graduate schools, four libraries, two university hospitals, 21 research institutes and facilities. Furthermore, we have four overseas centers in the USA, The Netherlands, Thailand and China.

The University of Osaka is one of the most innovative universities in Japan with outstanding, cutting-edge research in fields such as immunology and quantum information/quantum biology.

The University of Osaka also has strongly promoted university-industry co-creation and receives substantial joint research funding from industry. There are about 100 research laboratories and units sponsored by companies on campus.

-D1.1.4 Of which was derived from donations and endowments

refers to funds received by the institution or institutional endowment from individuals, corporations, foundations, alumni organizations, or other external entities, with no restrictions or only limited restrictions on

-D1.1.5 Of which was derived from self-operating activities and investments

refers to the revenues generated by the institution through self-operating activities, service provision, investments (including investments of endowment funds), and the management or utilization of institutional assets.
