Is this harassment? (1)

Osaka University defines "harassment" in three ways. Let's examine each. The first is "sexual harassment."

As defined in the "Anti-Harassment Policy of Osaka University," sexual harassment is "any unwanted sexual comment or behavior made by taking advantage of a person's relationship with another person, regardless of when and where such comment or behavior takes place." What makes this form of harassment unique in comparison to the others is that its defining characteristic is the feeling of discomfort in the recipient. In many cases, particularly due to hierarchy, the recipient may not be able to voice his or her discomfort, so many times the offense is pointed out by a third party. The Office encourages all students, faculty and staff to reconsider their actions occasionally and reflect on whether they may have made anyone uncomfortable in this way.

3. Opening up and feeling better:

In order to resolve any issues, we will act in accordance with the wishes of the recipient. We will never act without the consent of the recipient. We are meticulously careful to ensure that those who receive consultations will suffer no disadvantages due to their consultations.
